## **Program Outcomes Report**

## Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) program

In this reporting period (through Spring 2016) 16 students graduated. The overall Completion rate within the expected time frame is 80% for this group of recent graduates. In the current reporting period, the number of years to complete the CMHC program has varied from 2.3 years to 3.3 years with an average of 2.9 years. The Counseling and Human Development program does not operate on a strict cohort model and accommodates both full-time and part-time students. Most all students work full-time while they are in the program and thus their student status (full-time vs part-time) may vary from semester to semester. Those who start as full-time students and wish to maintain employment, becomes part-time students during Practicum and Internship. Over nine of the last ten years, CHMC and Dual (both CMHC and SC programs) students have a 100% pass rate on the NCE for initial licensure (including a 94% pass rate in the past academic year representing one retake). The pass rate for the independent NCMHCE clinical licensure test in the past academic year was 100%, and has been between 83 – 90% for nine years prior to this. The job placement rate for CMHC (and Dual) students over the last 180 days is 93% (CMHC and Dual students); this includes those who graduated in May, 2016.

## School Counseling (SC) program

In this reporting period (through Spring 2016) 5 students graduated. The completion rate within the expected time frame is 100% for this group of recent graduates. In the current reporting period the number of years to complete the SC program has varied from 1.7 to 3 years, with an average of 2.9 years. The Counseling and Human Development program does not operate on a strict cohort model and accommodates both full-time and part-time students. Most all students work full-time while they are in the program and thus their student status (full-time vs part-time) may vary from semester to semester. Those who start as full-time students and wish to maintain employment, become part-time during Practicum and Internship. Over nine of the last ten years, SC students have had a 100% pass rate on the SC licensure exam (including a 100% pass rate in the past academic year). The job placement rate for SC students over the last 180 days is 80%; this includes those who graduated in May, 2016.
