



2026-2027 Verification Worksheet – Dependent Students (V1/V5)

Your application was selected by the U.S. Dept. of Education for review in a process called “Verification.” In this process, we are required by federal law (34 CFR, Part 668) to compare the information on your FAFSA with the information provided on this Worksheet and with your **2024** federal tax information (and your parent’s if you are considered dependent for federal aid purposes). If there are differences between your application and the documents you have submitted, corrections may need to be made.

We cannot process your financial aid until verification has been completed, so please provide the required documents as soon as possible. As stated above, in addition to completing this worksheet, you must also provide federal tax information.

This is a federally-mandated process.

B. Family Information

- (c) any other people if they live with your parent; and they receive more than half of their support from your parent; and they will continue to receive more than half their support from your parent during the award year.

Write the names of all household members who meet the definition above and their relationship to you. If the parent were to file a U.S. tax return at the time of completing the 2026-2027 FAFSA and the provided criteria for “dependent children” or “other persons” align with the requirement of family size, the parent could claim them as a dependent. The parent should not include any unborn children in the family size. If more space is needed, provide a separate page with the student’s name and ID number at the top.

C. 2023 Income Information for Student and Each Parent in the Household

Instructions: As part of federal student aid eligibility, students and parents will be required to consent and approve sharing of imported income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. In other words, if the parents filed separate 2024 IRS income tax returns, both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information from the IRS. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2024 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA.

Answer all that apply: Use "P" for Parent, "S" for Student

To get transcript online – Go to www.irs.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript Online." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and NOT the "Account Transcript."
Or you can call 800-908-9946 or you can complete and mail IRS Form 4506-T to the IRS.

I/my spouse (if married) filed a 2024 Amended IRS Income Tax Return. (Provide a signed copy of the 2024 IRS Form 1040X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return that was filed with the IRS and a signed copy of the original 2024 IRS Form 1040 and the applicable schedules that were filed with the IRS.)

I/my spouse (if married) filed a 2024 Tax Deadline Extension. (Provide a copy of the IRS's approval of an extension beyond the automatic six-month extension for tax year 2024)

I/my spouse (if married) were victims of IRS Tax-Related Identity Theft (Provide a Tax Return Data Base View (TRDBV) transcript obtained from the IRS and a signed and dated statement that you are a victim of IRS tax-related identity theft and that the IRS is aware of the tax-related identity theft.)

I/my spouse (if married) filed Non-IRS Income Tax Returns (Provide a signed copy of his or her income tax return that was filed with the relevant tax authority.)

I/my spouse (if married) will not file federal taxes for 2024 *and am not required to do so.*

REQUIRED (even if no income was earned): Provide documentation from the IRS dated on or after October 1, 2026 that indicates a 2024 IRS income tax return was not filed with the IRS or other relevant tax authority for you/your spouse. This can be obtained by completing an IRS form 4506-T or by going to www.irs.gov and attempting to request a tax return transcript for 2024. (If married, separate documentation is required for each person.)
