NCAA Compliance Task 1

All student-athletes must complete academic and amateurism certification through the NCAA Eligibility Center; please follow the task below if you have not done so already:

- A. Submit your ACT or SAT scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center. All scores must be sent directly from the testing agency to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- B. After you graduate, ask your HS counselor to submit your final official transcript with proof of graduation to the NCAA Eligibility Center.
- C. Request final Amateurism in your sport through the NCAA Eligibility Center.

All student-athletes must complete Annual NCAA Student-Athlete Forms electronically. Please review the tips below:

- The Annual NCAA Student-Athlete Forms will be sent to your **Walsh University email address in mid-July**.
- The email comes from noreply@ncaa.org
- All minors will have to print out the electronic Annual NCAA Student-Athlete Forms and have a parent or legal guardian sign the Annual NCAA Student-Athlete Forms.
 - Signed minor forms can be sent to tmohr@walsh.edu or dropped off in the Walsh University Compliance Office.

Sports Medicine Task 1-8

Walsh University's Athletic Department's goal is to minimize all risk of injury while participating in your athletic endeavors. The first line of defense in helping to provide you with a safe environment to compete in is by obtaining a complete medical history in compliance with the regulations and guidelines that the NCAA has established. **Failure to complete this required information will result in delaying your ability to participate in team activities.**

1. *Pre-Participation Physical*- The NCAA requires a physical done within six months of your first date of athletic activity at the university. This physical must be performed by a MD, DO or their designate, per NCAA guidelines. Once you provide this physical, we will perform a physical health screen the remaining years of competition here at Walsh University.
2. *Sickle Cell Trait Status*- Sickle Cell Trait is one of the leading causes of death in college athletics. The test for this condition is a blood test that was mostly likely done in your newborn screening. If you have access to this lab work, we will accept this for this requirement. If not, we ask that you have the test performed and the results forwarded to the Athletic Training Department. This test is **Mandatory** and there is no waiver.
3. *ATS Online Profile*- The athletic training staff at Walsh University uses a secure electronic medical records software named ATS. Please go to walsh2.atsusers.com The first time you log into the system it will ask you a for an ID/password. Type in **new/new**. Once it will make you fill out a demographic page and a new ID/password, this can be anything you would like.
4. *ATS Medical History and Immunizations*- On ATS click the Athlete Information Icon and you will find a series of tabs. On the Medical History Tab answer the yes or no questions and provide any information that is required. Immunizations Tab, please give us your immunization dates and if you have a copy of these records, upload them into the program.
5. *ATS Insurance*- Walsh University requires all students to maintain primary health insurance. Fill out the information located in this tab and then either upload a copy of your insurance cards into the program or email a copy of your card to dwillmott@walsh.edu.
6. *ATS Contacts*- Please provide the information for an emergency contact, in case need arises. These individuals will not be contacted unless a significant injury occurs or you have requested that we reach out to them.
7. *ATS Forms*- Under the Forms Tab, there is a drop down box with five forms. You need to fill out each of these forms and electronically sign them. If you are under the age of eight-teen a parent or guardian needs to co-sign them.
8. *eFiles*-In this tab you will find a copy of the Pre-Participation Physical Form, the NCAA Banned Drugs list, Minor Consent and the department's ADD/ADHD Medical Exemption request form.

Walsh University's Sports Medicine staff has the ultimate say in clearance of a student-athlete for participation in intercollegiate athletics. If there are any questions on any conditions or medical history a representative from the Athletic Training Department will be in contact request supporting documentation for further review.
