### **GEN ED CORE CURRICULUM OVERVIEW**

The Office of the Registrar receives many inquiries

about the General Education Curriculum. Here is a brief summary of the Gen Ed Curriculum for 25-26. \* Students are required to take FYE 101 their Freshman Year and **GE 400** their Senior Year. They must take 33 credit hours of Foundation (FD) coursework. The FD coursework includes ENG 101 and 102; THEO 101 and 102,; MATH 104 or 121; courses in PHIL; HIST or ENG LIT; ARHI, ART, MUS or VPA; SOC or PSYC; and GFA or ECON. In addition, they are required to take one 3 credit hour science course that is FD designated. \*Students must complete 12 credit hours in required designations (CH, SL and CIT)- one 3-credit hour course designated Cultural Humility (CH), one 3-credit hour course designated Service Learning (SL), and two 3-credit courses, for a total of 6 credits, in courses with the Catholic Intellectual Tradition (CIT) designation. \*12 credit hours must also be completed in Exploratory Themes (TH1, TH2 and TH3). Students are required to choose two of these three themes and complete 6 credit hours within each theme. \*Courses designated as CH, SL, CIT, or Themes (TH1, TH2, or TH3) will not transfer into Walsh. \*Note that courses taken within an academic major or required to fulfill the Core curriculum cannot be repeated for credit at another institution.

Students interested in adding an additional major or minor must consult their academic advisor before submitting the appropriate form. Requests require approval from the academic advisor, relevant division chair(s), and the Office of the Registrar before changes are made to the student's record. Each additional major must include at least 18 unique credit hours, and each minor must have at least 9 unique credit hours (with at least 6 credit hours completed at Walsh if prior coursework was transferred).
